

Pediatric Rehabilitation Options if ineligible for services



If your child or youth is ineligible for services, you may wish to look into:

- Alberta Education: Consider talking to your child's school about your concerns.
- Family Supports for Children with Disabilities (FSCD): Families must meet criteria to be eligible for the program. Visit the [website](#) to learn more.
- First Nations Health Consortium: The First Nations Health Consortium helps families access education, health or social programs to meet their child's needs. The team reduces stress on families by helping them navigate provincial and federal service systems. If there is a gap in services or lack of a program available to meet the child's needs, they work with the family to complete and submit an application for Jordan's Principle funding. - Private practice: Families can choose to pay out of pocket or use third-party insurance to visit a private or community provider of their choice. These websites may be helpful for finding private practice therapy services:
